







How do you rate the Vietnamese government's response to the current outbreak?




Do you think the Vietnamese Government has been effective in communicating health and safety updates with respect to Covid-19?



How concerned are you about the economic impact of the latest Covid outbreak in Vietnam and the region?




To what extent has the current outbreak impacted your business operations in Vietnam?




Top 7 business challenges right now? (1 = the biggest challenge)

- 7 - Increased Costs


What measures is your company taking to ensure your workforce remains healthy?

Is your company restricting business-related travel within Vietnam?




Top 5 challenges for bringing in people from outside Vietnam


(1 = the biggest challenge)

- 5 - Predictable travel arrangements (airline/hotel)


If the mandatory quarantine period for fully vaccinated in-bound travelers drops from 21-days to 7-days, would your company bring more people from abroad here?
